HISTORY OF BALL CLASSIC AMERICAN IS THE LEADER

Has Won Thirty-Three Games to the National League's Thirty-One in the World's Series—Longest Series Was in 1912 When Red Sox Downed Giants.

New York, Sept. 27.—In view of the keen interest in the coming world series between the New York Nationals and the Chicago Americans, the records of the inter-league contests of the past assume unusual prominence.

Since that year the winning clubs in the American League have met each October to decide, in a series of the best four games out of seven, which team should be entitled to the championship honors of the professional baseball world for that season.

During these series, sixty-six games have been played, giving an average of five and a half games per series, including the contests which there have been in games won by the American League.

The American League has won thirty-one, while the 445 runs scored, the National League Clubs have won seven and their National League rivals five.
