ASPARAGUS ADVANCED

Hot House Cucumbers Are Scarce and the Price Has Increased.

The first car of California fruits, consisting of apricots, peaches and cherries. arrived at the wholesale fruit market yesterday, consigned to McWilliam & Everist, and divided between that firm and White & Co., the peaches selling at \$2.75 to \$3 per case; the apricots at \$3, and the cherries at \$2.50 to \$3 for 11, 10 and 9 rows, respectively,

Asparagus was only shipped in lightly yesterday, and, as the week-end demand is always greater, the price advanced slightly, the small quantity of choice quality selling at \$1.35 per 11-quart hasket, the bulk of the balance of sood selling at \$1.25, and poorer going at \$1, and will in all probability bring higher prices today.


