**Trial of Filipino Police  
Is Indefinitely Postponed**

Manila, Dec. 29.—Arraignments of 17 constabulary soldiers on charges of murder in connection with the Dec. 15, which resulted in 66 deaths, was postponed indefinitely upon request of the counsel.

Trial of eight of the soldiers on sedition charges opens Jan. 1, the remaining 66 having pleaded guilty.

It is understood that the trial of the balance of the soldiers will be held in a separate trial.

The riots of Dec. 15, between Manila police and Filipino citizens, will be taken up at completion of the sedition trial.
