A station on the CPR, and on the South Thompson River, (which furnishes power), in the District of Yale-Kootenay, 204 miles north-east of Vancouver, and 47 miles west of Kamloops, the nearest banking point. It contains a flour mill, an Anglican church and a public school, and is the distributing point for all points on the Cariboo wagon road, as far as Barkerville, with which it is telegraph communication. Stages tri-weekly to Clinton, and weekly to Barkerville and all intermediate points. Population 200. Telegraph, CPR. Express. Dom. Mail daily. W B V Bailey, postmaster.
