## TOWNSHIP OF WILLOUGHBY.

The township of Willoughby is bounded on the north by the township of Stamford, on the east by the Niagara river, on the south by the township of Bertie, and on the west by the township of Crowland. It contains 18,666 acres, and as early as 1784 there were a few settlers in the township, although it was not surveyed and laid out till the year 1787. The face of the country is rather flat, and portions of it are rather low; and the timber is principally hardwood with a mixture of pine. By the last census it contained 1,539 inhabitants, and 5,652 bushels of fall wheat, 15,044 bushels of spring wheat, 21,597 bushels of barley, 1,277 bushels of rye, 68,252 bushels of oats, 15,782 bushels of potatoes, 1,247 lbs. of maple sugar, 15,441 gallons of cider, 5,734 lbs. of wool, 49,110 lbs. of butter, and 1,155 lbs. of cheese were produced from the crops of 1861.
