



The United States expects to secure a very large trade in lumber with Eu-rope r war. A conference was held i ______o this week to form plans for the ______estigation of lumber trade conditions which will exist in Europe following the close of the war. The American Lumberman says:

"The interests that manufacture sub stitutes for lumber have already placed representatives in the field to study the situation in Europe in order to gain an exact idea of what will be needed in reconstruction supplies from America. There is no doubt that the close of the war will find enormous demand for lum-ber, part of which will come from Amber, part of which will come from Am-erica, although different parts of the world will make strong attempts to supply the demand, especially Norway and Sweden.
