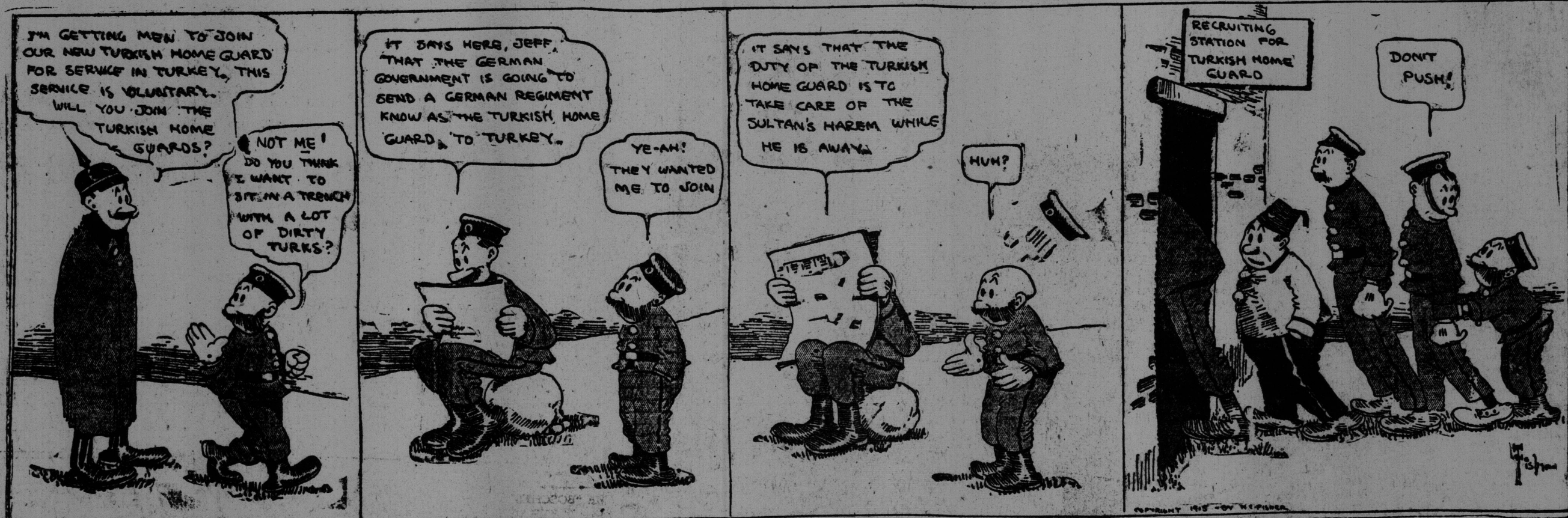

corted to the Armory--A Fine

The unpleasant and stormy weather of yesterday morning did not interfere with the cordiality of the welcome given to the 52nd battalion from Port Arthur, Ont., on their arrival in St. John for the winter. Under Lieut. Col. Hay they reached the city in two special trains with 1,600 officers and men, and were received enthusiastically by a large gathering of citizens who also lined the route of their march to the armory from the depot, cheering heartily as they passed.

Major Frink extended an official welcome in behalf of the city in a vigorous address.

Lieutenant-Colonel Hay briefly responded. A procession was then formed in the following order:

A Khaki Club for soldiers was opened in Montreal this week. The Montreal Mail says--

"The club is for the comfort of all the soldiers on duty in the city and for the reception of the wounded. Many of the 73rd Highlanders and the 60th Battalion took advantage of the opportunity of visiting the comfortable club last night and read papers in the reading room, wrote letters, or played billiards. The club is pleasantly located. A short avenue leads to the hall door. In front there is a green lot on either side of the avenue, and at the rear there is a kitchen garden. The use of the house and grounds has been given to the Khaki League by the people of St. George's church. A fortnight ago the work of painting and outfitting the place was begun, and in that time the building, which had been in a rather dilapidated state, was transformed. There are several apartments, all well furnished. All the furnishings have been donated. The only items that had to be paid for were the beds, and these contain twenty-five beds. Soldiers on the way to their homes will be kept there at night until it is convenient for them to go on."
