The post office was established in 1851. N. W. Chester was the first postmaster. The situation of the village is high and healthy. It contains one steam saw and grist mill, two hotels, three stores, three blacksmith shops, two waggon shops, and two churches—Presbyterian and Primitive Methodist. Daily stages between Widder and Arkona. A. Duffus, postmaster. Population, 200.
