## FAITH AND WORK PUT DEPRESSION WHERE IT BELONGS AS CITIZENS START TO BUILD UP BURNED AREA

One Result of Fire Has Been That Main Street Has Been Created a Fire District, Where All Buildings Must Be of Concrete, Brick or Stone or a Combination of These—Town is Marching Forward Under the Banner of Progress.

If Sussex may be regarded as typical of New Brunswick towns, then faith and work have put depression where it should be, and are marching forward under the banner of progress. The Telegraph-Journal on Thursday was regarded as having been rather hard hit. It had been dependent upon lumber conditions, perhaps to a larger extent than the people realize, despite the fact that it is the centre of so fine an agricultural and dairy district. The large number of people engaged in these occupations were also affected. Small retail businesses were not able to cut as much as usual. J. Prescott & Sons, operating at Goose Creek, have not been operating on a large scale for several years. For these reasons general business in Sussex suffered. Then came the fire, causing a loss of about \$225,000, with \$150,000 insurance.

Where Butter and Ice Cream Are Made.

The Sussex Cheese & Butter Co., Ltd., of which Silas C. McCully is manager, will produce more this year. Last year the company sold ice cream to the value of \$88,000 in the New Brunswick market, and expect this year to show an increase over the corresponding month of last year. The total for the year will show a large growth in the trade.

The company ships its butter all over this province and Nova Scotia, with an especially good market in Sydney.

This company operates on the cooperative plan, and receives milk from three hundred and fifty farmers. From the price of the produce, the better for each farmer. The company has now been in operation twenty-seven years, and is of the greatest benefit to the surrounding community of farmers. Its butter has won the highest award at many exhibitions, including the St. John and Halifax fairs. The butter output in June was 16,000 pounds in excess of that of June last year.

A Live Athletic Association.

With regard to the concrete industry, it is also one of the most active in the province. The plan is to produce in the province. His plant is right beside that for gravel and sand grading. An elevator carries the same up to the chamber where it is mixed with cement, and the mixture falls down into the moulds where it is pressed into a concrete product. It is then after drying for twenty-four hours they are ready for use. The plant can make 600 blocks per hour. These are right-hand blocks, but there is also a machine to make left-hand blocks, and left-hand blocks, making with the larger blocks and an inch and a half space a thirteen inch wide block. The blocks are stamped in a day. Both kinds of blocks are made in the same way. The concrete is made in a building for Fairweather's, Ltd. Mr. McAllister also makes concrete pipe, and concrete blocks for sills and windows, and roofing tiles. He also gives concrete a stucco face as required, using sand of varying colors to produce a required effect, and corner blocks can be made darker in color by a simple process.

Products of this plant are shipped to various parts of the province. Mr. McAllister is also in charge of the gravel grading plant. These industries, especially that for concrete products, are capable of considerable expansion. Considerable gravel has been shipped to date to Charlottetown.
