

JOKE LEADS TO SERIOUS QUARREL

Man Hacked Fatally With Hatchet, Found Jammed in a Trunk.

New York, June 14.—A feeling that all was not well at home caused Mrs. Kate Pananko to leave work Tuesday afternoon and hasten to her apartment at 515 East Fifteenth Street. She found her husband, Henry Pananko, seated astride a big green trunk, waving a hatchet in each hand, and shouting excitedly.

"I've got him—I've got him!" She ran to the street for Patrolman John Harkins and together they returned to the house. Pananko was subdued quickly and the trunk opened. Inside they found John Possaki, 44 years old, of 248 Avenue B, his skull fractured, his nose cut off and his face and neck hacked.

The wounded man was lying on his back, his knees doubled up under his chin, and his wrists and ankles bound with fragments of cord. Dr. Rose C. Boyer, who took him to Bellevue, said that he probably would die.

Mrs. Pananko said her husband had been acting queerly for some time. About eighteen months ago, he was released from the Ward's Island Insane Asylum where he had been confined two years. He had not been able to work since, but apparently had fully recovered his faculties.

Sunday, Mrs. Pananko said, she noticed her husband acting queerly. He was unusually quarrelsome and so violent that she spent Sunday night with a friend, being afraid to return home. In the morning she went to work in a restaurant where she is employed as a cook. But all the time, she felt that something was wrong. By three o'clock she could stand it no longer so she went home. Pananko told several conflicting stories about the affair, the police say. One version was that he left home early in the morning and returned to find Possaki rummaging through his trunk. He said that he kept \$150 in cash in the trunk and accused Possaki of trying to rob him. This, he said, provoked a fight in which he struck Possaki with the hatchet several times.

But, according to neighbors, Pananko left the house about 10 o'clock and was seen returning with Possaki shortly before noon. Both men, they said, appeared to have been drinking, and were heard quarrelling in the Pananko apartment. According to the janitor of the house, "Pananko was a model neighbor and never beat anyone but his wife."

Possaki regained consciousness at the hospital and was questioned. He is said to have told detectives that he and Pananko were "only fooling" and that the whole thing grew out of a joke.

Pananko was locked up, charged with felonious assault. Should Possaki die, the charge will be changed to manslaughter.

TOMBS PRISONER BARS DOOR TO 5 AFTER 2 ESCAPE

Laborer, Held in Shooting of Chief Inspector Lutz, Fights Cell Mates After Failing to Catch Fugitives

New York, June 14.—Two prisoners being held for examination in Tombs Court detention pen escaped from jail when the keeper's key broke in the lock instead of forcing the bolt home. The keeper, returning a few moments later, discovered James Comerford, the laborer who is charged with shooting Albert Lutz, chief inspector of the Bureau of Weights and Measures, last Thursday, standing a righteous guard at the door and barring the way to freedom to five other prisoners.

The two men who escaped were Henry Libera, twenty-eight years old, and William Schneider, twenty-four years old. They were arraigned in Tombs Court as fugitives from justice from Hudson County, New Jersey, in connection with the robbery of an automobile trucked of silk valued at \$22,000.

Two other occupants of the detention pen with Comerford were Christian Wolf and Carl Bothner, who were arrested Saturday and held in \$50,000 bail each for further examination in the loss of \$1,000 worth of securities by C. D. Barney & Co. on June 5. Beszech Their Freedom.

The youths, with the three other mutineers, were clustered about Comerford, beseeching and threatening him, when Keeper William Reynolds came back down the corridor. "Break the law, will you?" Comerford, a burly man, was thundering. "Hop out of jail, will you! You just want to get some cigarettes, is it? I'll show you—stand back!"

His heavy arm came down like a fall on the shoulder of one of the youths, and the fire retreated before his wrath. Comerford, almost weeping with rage, confided to Reynolds how he caught hold of the coat of one of the escaping men and almost managed to hold him back. The two who escaped fled down the corridor to a passageway to Lafayette street, opened a door there that had a key in it, and vanished.

Reynolds called court attendants to guard the men and hurried to report to Warden John J. Hanley. What occurred there is best recorded in Hanley's words. "Keeper J. Speckles. "I was sitting in my office," said the warden, "when Reynolds came bursting in. His eyes were starting from his head. His face was covered with sweat. He didn't speak. He couldn't. He ran across the office and fell heavily into a chair panting.
