BUSINESS MEN AND FOREIGN POLICY

The First and Foremost Concern Says Prof. Munroe to Halifax Commercial Club—The Pacific Problem.

"The important thing about the business man of today is his views on foreign policy," said Professor Henry F. Munroe, Professor of International Law at Columbia University, New York, at the weekly luncheon of the Commercial Club of Halifax last Friday. Prof. Munroe, who is a Nova Scotian, said that he had been spending many pleasant days on the North West Arm. He had not followed all of the proceedings at Washington, but he was well acquainted with the antecedents which had led up to the disarmament conference. Today, a business man was not only

concerned in foreign policy, but it was his first and foremost concern. Business was in a state of unrest because the business man did not know where to jump.

A little over two years ago he had had the honor of addressing the club on the subject of the Treaty of Versailles. That treaty had marked the closing of one epoch, and the opening of another. We were now facing the great question of the Pacific. Europe would never again be the storm centre of diplomacy. The British empire and the United States were alone the only nations remaining on their feet after the war. The United States recently thought that world politics were no concern of theirs, but conditions had changed in this respect within the last two years.

Technically speaking, the British empire appeared for the first time in the Treaty of Versailles. Three states controlled the destiny of the world—Great Britain, the United States, and Japan—all three were naval powers, and what was more—Pacific powers. The British empire was no longer a European empire, but a world-wide empire.

Japan's Progress.
When President Harding undertook the Disarmament Conference, the great matter for discussion was to be "Naval Power" in the Pacific. It took 100 years to build up the situation which led to

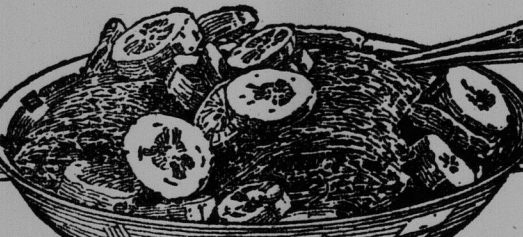

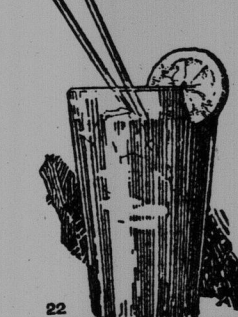
