#### CANADIAN SOLDIER WEDS BELGIAN GIRL; COURTSHIP BRIEF

London, Dec. 7.—A young Canadian  
private, Victor Albert Baker, an engine  
driver of the C. P. R., is back to Sal-  
bury after one of the most hastily made  
marriages on record.  
Seven weeks ago another Canadian  
soldier introduced him to his cousin,  
a Belgian refugee, Bertha Van den Bosch,  
who was being cared for in a hospital  
attached to the Congregational church  
at Nunhead. Bertha is twenty years of  
age, and comes from Antwerp where she  
was cashier in an hotel.  
The language difficulty was a seri-  
ous one, but was overcome and at the  
second meeting after the introduction  
Private Baker proposed marriage. He  
saw her twice more after that, and mar-  
ried her last week.  
The bride's mother and father are  
stranded on the continent, but nearly  
approved came from the girl's uncle and  
aunt, also refugees from Belgium. The  
bridegroom wore khaki as also did  
his father who is training with him.  
The honeymoon was limited to one day.  
The mayors of Canterbury attend-  
ed the wedding ceremony, at which one  
of the guests offered the bride and  
bridegroom his advice.  
"If you don't learn each other's lan-  
guage you will be the happiest man and  
wife in the world."  
The bride is to go to the home of the  
husband's parents in Canada to await  
his return from the war.

#### RETURN OF U-9 TO KIEL

Weddigen Used Last Torpedo to Sink  
Cressy  
New York, Dec. 6.—Dr. F. Zimmer-  
man, of Newark, has received an inter-  
esting letter from his brother, Kurt,  
a first lieutenant in the German navy. It  
says:  
"Yesterday morning the U-9 the subma-  
rine which destroyed the English  
cruiser Cressy. We of the (name of the  
cruiser), and of course the crews of  
the other ships anchoring here, greeted  
Commander Weddigen's arrival. The  
bands of all ships played "Die Wacht  
am Rhein."  
"It seemed a triumphal procession.  
What joy these heroes have felt! It  
was a moment never to be forgotten by  
them nor by us, their admiring com-  
rades. What joy Captain Weddigen  
have felt when he had the three big  
cruisers with 2,800 men before the  
tube and pressed the trigger which lets  
the torpedo fly? In a few moments he  
had sent 1,700 men into eternity. Ter-  
rible, but great! If only I might be five  
minutes in his skin to feel what he  
must feel. Those 1,700 men I should  
gladly take on my conscience,  
for its receptive capacity in that re-  
spect is without limit.  
"If only our battleship squadrons,  
especially mine, soon may get at the  
enemy in open day fight. I know that  
we will give a good account of ourselves,  
and thank God, those atrocities which  
have been perpetrated by Belgians and  
Frenchmen, are impossible on our side.  
It seems to me that the English are not  
quite so brave as most of their allies. On  
August 28 they saved a good many of  
our men when our cruisers went down,  
in the most gallant manner.  
"I have seen a copy of the war diary  
of U-9. Weddigen's notes are short and  
to the point of military exactness. A  
hit! Ship listed heavily, and while it  
capsized and sank I turned to attack  
the next cruiser and so forth. When  
the Cressy refused to sink from the first  
torpedo between the ribs, and then she  
obeyed. This splendid victory only cost  
us 120,000 marks (\$30,000), the price of  
the six torpedoes."
