The citizens of Ottawa realize the value of technical education, and will make in-

The citizens of Ottawa realize the value of technical education, and will make in creased provision for it in connection with the public school system of the city. The Journal says that it is likely the sum of \$80,000 will be spent in the near future by the public school board to erect an addition to the building now used as a technical school. The new structure will be three stories high, will have a gymnasium and lecture room and twelve class rooms, will have the latest appliances for a technical course, and will accommodate five or six hundred pupils.

Beyond an occasional spasmodic expression of belief that technical instruction should be given, there is no evidence that the citizens realize its value.
