AGENT'S REPORT.

To the President and Committee of the Nova Scotia Auxiliary Bible Society:

GENTLEMEN,—In view of limiting our printed Annual to the one cent postal rate, my report of Branch visitation will again have the economic virtue of brevity.

My first journey began on March 9th, and ended on May 5th, a few days being lost by heavy snow storms.
