## BEN COULON, REAL BOY MANAGER OF BROTHER JOHN, SAYS "HAVE THE CHAMPION, THEY WILL HAVE TO SHOW ME"

Upon the shoulders of Ben Coulon has fallen the managerial mantle of the late E. E. Coulon, father of the "fighting Coulons" of Logan Square, Chicago.

It was E. E. Coulon who brought his son John from obscurity to the top rung of his class and "finessed" him through the maze of troubles that beset a successful boxer.

Champion Johnny has started training, after a rest of seven months, following the sudden and unexpected death of his father.

Brother Ben may properly be called a "boy manager," for he is only 21. He is the youngest that ever looked after the affairs of a champion.

And don't imagine that managers of title hunters, or clever promoters, are finding Manager Ben soft picking. For several years he acted as assistant to his father, when that cleverest of match makers was looking after the affairs of the champion, and learned much.

One of the first things Ben did was to turn down an offer of \$5000 from Tom McCaray of Los Angeles, to fight Danny Webster.

"McCaray wants John to let Webster weigh in at 205 lbs.," said Ben. "And when they climbed into the ring Webster would weigh 120."

"You hear a lot about Johnny making boys weigh in at 115 and 116. Why shouldn't he? He won the title inside the limit and he never weighs more than 112 or 113 ringside. People who think he cannot make 115 are mistaken."

"That Marquis of Queensberry told John he ought to be a 'good fellow' and give away three or four pounds. As a matter of fact, he gives three or four pounds almost every time he boxes. With the use of having a 'buss limit' if it isn't lived up to."

And there's more than a homeopathic dose of common sense in that query. Johnny will take it easy on his campaign. He will box some short distance bouts around Chicago and then he expects to be the "busy kid."

"We don't care who they are or how fast they come," said the boy manager. "All we ask is that the offers are to be attractive and that the boys make the weight. Johnny is business."

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND PATENTATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Patents—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in section alongside his homestead. Price \$200 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate six acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$1000.
