One of the most interesting fox cases tried in the Supreme Court since the industry was established in P. E. Island, was that of B. Carruthers and others against R. A. Taylor and J. W. Carruthers of Montague. The plaintiffs in the suit reside in Saskatchewan and organized a company in Lashburne, Sask., known as the Lashburne Fox Co. They purchased from the plaintiffs in 1914, 1912 a female fox under a contract by which it was provided amongst other things that the defendants would mate the female fox so sold with a fox of their own and provide the produce between the plaintiff and the defendants. It was further provided by the agreement that if anything should happen to the fox purchased by the plaintiff, that the defendants would lend to the plaintiffs a female fox until such time as the plaintiff so btained their share of a litter. It was contended by the plaintiffs that they never have received their share of the little, and on the part of the defendant, twas claimed that the female fox did produce a litter which died immediately after being born. The defendant, Taylor, who had charge of the ranch in which the foxes were, contended that the litter was born alive and that this was a fulfilment of the contract. This was disputed by the plaintiff who contended first that the mother of the foxes died without having produced any live liter, and that in any event there was by the plaintiff who contended first that the mother of the foxes died without having produced any live litter, and that in any event there was no litter available from which they receive their share of same. The dendants, John W. Carruthers, did not contest the suit, but conceded that there was a breach of contract on the part of himself and his co-defendant and asserted that he was willing to pay his shares of the damages.
