Philadelphia, Nov. 12.—More than one hundred resolutions dealing with the many problems of union labor, occuts, jurisdictional differences, the European war and the social welfare of workmen, have been presented to the American Federation of Labor Convention for its consideration.

Continuing the resolution said: "That the convention of the American Federation of Labor, in view of the general peace congress, which no doubt will be held at the close of the war, for the purpose of adjusting claims and differences, hold itself in readiness and authorize the executive council to call a meeting of representatives of organized labor of the different nations, to the end that suggestions may be made and such action taken as shall be helpful in restoring fraternal relations, protecting the interests of the tollers and thereby assisting in laying foundations for a more lasting peace."
