COL. COOPER GIVES ADDRESS

Before Y. W. P. A.—Large Attendance at Meeting.

Lieut. Col. Cooper advanced in his address before a large meeting of the Young Women's Patriotic Association in the

Loyal Order of Moose rooms, last evening. Miss Alice Fairweather, 1st vice-president, was in the chair.

Deep interest was shown in a business-like talk given by Col. Cooper, who, in the course of his remarks referred to the fact that in other cities of the Dominion munition work is done by women who have proved themselves

capable of turning out better work than the men and the able-bodied men are released for active service. Machinery such as used in England is installed by means of which the heavy shells are lifted. The speaker also

congratulated the Y.W.P.A. on their platform and thanked the women of St. John for the good work they had done and were doing for the soldiers. He made a plea that the women and children of the soldier should not be forgotten.
