GREAT BRITAIN LOST
8,946,000 TONS
Submarine and Mine Losses
Partially Replaced by 5,443,000 Tons.
London, Nov. 6.—(Canadian Press Despatch from Reuter's Limited)—Speaking in the House of Commons today, Right Hon. Thomas Hames MacNamara, parliamentary secretary to the Admiralty, stated that 8,946,000 tons of British merchant ships had been lost during the war up to September 30 last by enemy action. Of this number 5,443,000 tons had been replaced by new construction and by the purchase of ships abroad, and the utilization of captured enemy ships.

Every Employer shall, on or before the 15th day of November, cause to be furnished to the Workmen's Compensation Board at the City of St. John, an estimate or estimates of the probable amount of the payroll of each of his industries within the scope of Part I of the Act, together with such further information as may be required by the Board for the purpose of assigning such industry to the proper class or classes, and of making the assessment hereunder.
And Further Notice that any Employer neglecting or refusing to furnish such estimate or information is liable to a penalty not exceeding \$20.00 per day for each day of such default, and is further liable for damages, as provided by Part II. of said Act, in respect of any injury to any workman in his employ during the period of such default.
