St. Luke's church offering on Easter Sunday was: St. Luke's parish church, \$2,102.66; St. Clement's, \$1,192.66; St. John's, \$1,192.66; total, \$4,488.98. This is regarded as probably the largest collection taken in any Protestant church in St. John.

A month ago the pastor, Rev. R. P. McKim, addressing his congregation, gave a statement of the church finances and asked them for a special collection on Easter Sunday. He named \$1,000 and when the contributions of the day were tallied they were found to amount to \$1,200.73. Since then the collection at St. Luke's church, checks and other cash contributions from a few of the leading members of the church have made the amount far in excess of the sum asked for by the pastor, or \$1,225.57 in all. The membership of the church is not wealthy as a whole and the excellent response to the pastor's call is looked upon as a tribute to the esteem in which his congregation holds him.

Since 1900 the number of communicants has grown from 364 to 500. In 1900-1 the receipts for church purposes were \$6,922.74; in 1904 they were \$7,508.80, there were 41 baptisms, 38 confirmations, 19 marriages, 29 interments. The entire income including \$707.20 on hand from last year, and \$7,402.25 from ground rents, is \$15,856.90. The expenditure statement shows \$4,955.84 for salaries, \$854.15 choir and music, with other payments, amounting in all to \$14,210.75, leaving a balance on the year's operations of \$1,646.15. The fund held is \$71,200, and the sinking fund \$2,580.78.

The accounts of Percy A. Clarke, vestry clerk, were audited by H. R. Sturdee, who testifies them correct and carefully kept. Canon Richardson refers in his report to the services of the late Chas. F. Kinneer, and Mrs. Frances U. Hay, the late Mrs. Chas. E. Scamnell, and help of David Lang, W. D. Andrews, N. W. Brennan, Mr. Rice and Mr. Ford, and his curate, Rev. Mr. MacDonald. OLD TIMES IN THE PROVINCE

Almanac of 1835 Recalls Interesting Figures and Features of Our History

MANY HOLIDAYS

The Churches Here 70 Years Ago

—The Civic and Provincial Officials

Many Noted Names—A "Looker After Nuisances" Whose Office Should Be Revived.

Seventy years ago almanacs were not numerous but that a very respectable attempt was made to issue one containing as much information as possible is shown by an old copy of one published in 1835 by Henry Chubb and in the words of the title page, "sold at the Courier office, Market square."

Some general idea of the contents is afforded by the title page which is ornamented by a group engraving of a plough, harrow, rake, etc., with a wheat sheaf and other agricultural products placed on the top of a barrel. But the title inscription reads:

"The New Brunswick Almanac for the year of our Lord 1835, being the fifth of the reign of His Most Gracious Majesty William IV and the third after the death of George IV, calculated on the Meridian of Saint John, will serve for any other part of the province containing the usual astronomical calculations, list of provincial officers, sitting of the legislative assembly, and various literary, commercial, charitable and other institutions, with interesting and amusing miscellaneous articles and a corrected list of militia officers within the province."

The little volume contains much that is interesting on the lines of history, and the leading "Holidays at the Public Offices" are given in full. Under the heading of "Holidays" are listed the days of the year when public offices are closed, and the days when the government is in session.
