

destruction of the one, would inevitably surround and ultimately destroy the other, I refused to accede to the wishes of the petitioners.

A commission having been appointed at the last Annual Communication of Grand Lodge for the purpose of investigating the unhappy differences that have for some time past disturbed the harmony of Acacia Lodge, No. 8, and it having been represented to me that R. W. Brother Snow, one of the brethren named on the commission, had removed from the province, at the request of the other members of the commission, I appointed R. W. Brother C. J. McDonald to supply the vacancy occasioned by the removal from the jurisdiction of R. W. Brother Snow. The results of the labours of these brethren in the interests of peace will be presented to you at this Communication, and if ratified by you, will, I hope, restore to the Lodge that harmony that should always exist among brethren.
