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The professed defign of the meeting was to reform and amend the plant but in fact when they came to examine it they found themselves obliged to pass the same sentence on it that was once delivered concerning the famous poet, Alexander Pope, whole usual ejaculation was G-d mend me ! "Mend you, faid a hackney coachman, (looking with contempt on his dwarfifli form and hump back) "it would not be half fo much trouble to make a new one;" A new one was accordingly entered upon, and the fundamental principle of it was, nor to suppose men as good as they ought to be, but to take them as they are. " It is true, faid they, that all men are naturally free and equal; it is a very good idea, and ought to be underflood in every contract and cartnership which can be formed ; it may ferve as a check upon ambition and other human paffions,, and put people in mind that they may fome time or other be called to account by their equals. But it is as true that this equality is deftroyed by a thouland caules which exift in nature and in fociety. It is true that all beafts, birds, and fishes are naturally free - and equal in some respects, but yet we find them unequal in other respects. and one becomes the prey of another. There is, and always will be, a fuperiority and an inferiority, in lpite of all the fystems of metaphysics that ever existed. How can you prevent one man from being stronger orwiler, or richer than another ? and will not the flyong overcome the weak ? will not the cunning circumvent the foolifh? and will not the borrower become fervant to the lender? Is not this noble, free, and independent creature man, necessiarily subject to lords of his own species in every stage of his exiftence? When a child is he not under the command of his parents? fend him to school, place him out as an apprentice, put him on board a ship, enrol him in a company of militia, 'must he not be subject to a master? Place . him in any kind of lociety whatever, and he has wants to be supplied, and passions to be subdued; his active powers need to be directed, and his extravagancies to be controuled, and if he will not do it himfelf, fome body must do it for him. Self government is indeed the most prefect form of government in the world; but if men will not govern themfelves, they must have some governors appointed 'over them, who will keep them in order and make them do their duty. Now if there is in fact fuch an inequality exifting among us, why fhould we act as if no fuch thing exifted? We have tried the Beaver icheme of partnership long enough, and find it will not do. Let us then adopt the practice of another kind of industrious animals which we have among us-Let us imitate the Bees, who are governed by one supreme head, and under that direction conduct their whole cconomy with perfect order and regularity." 111111111111 On this principle they drew up an entire new plan, in which there was one chief fleward, who was to manage their united interest, and be responfible to the whole for his conduct. He was to have a kind of council to. advise and direct him, and several inferior officers to affist him, as there might be occasion; and a certain contribution was to be levied on the trade, or on the eftates of the whole, which was to make a common flock for the support of the common interest; and they were to erect a tribunal among themselves, which should decide and determine all differences: "If nine of the families should agree to this plan, it was to take place; and the others might or might not adopt it; but if any one fhould finally refule, or if any should adopt it and afterwards fall from/it, he was to be looked upon as an

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outcalt, and no perfon was to have any connection with him.

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
