7. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Eighty-six thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses, viz.:—Infantry School Buildings, &c., at Toronto, St. Johns, P.Q., and Fredericton, \$44,000; House and Furniture for High Commissioner for Canada, London, England, \$42,000, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

And the said Resolution was agreed to.

Sir Charles Tupper, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copies of letters from Messrs. Manning, McDonald & Co., dated respectively the 7th January, and 24th February, 1881, respecting the construction of Section B of the Canadian Pacific Railway. (Sessional Papers, No. 31bb.)

Mr. White (Renfrew) reported from the Committee of Supply, several Resolu-

tions; which were read, as follow:-

1. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Two hundred and eighty dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with the Library of Parliament: To provide for the salary of Mr. Thayne, \$200; Amount required to pay Wilson & Lamb the balance due them for the supply of five volumes of Sulte's "Histoire des Canadiens Français," \$80, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to aid "Montreal Womens' Protective Society," in connection with Immigra-

tion, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

3. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Thirty thousand and forty-five dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with Militia: Public armories and care of arms, \$8,000; Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, \$2,000; Military Properties—To provide for payment to the Executor of the estate of the late Enoch Walkely, compensation in full of all claims against the Government in connection with buildings or occupancy of land on the Ordnance Reserve, or other land, south side of Maria Street, City of Ottawa, \$200; Construction Repairs of Military Properties—For repairs and maintenance of buildings and barracks occupied by the Cavalry and Infantry School Corps, \$18,045; Ottawa Rifle Range—Repairs, \$1,800, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

4. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Six hundred and seventeen thousand three hundred and thirty-nine dollars and seventy-eight cents be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with Esquimalt Graving Dock: To recoup payment to Government of British Columbia for amount expended on work, to be expended in 1883-84, \$134,512.66; To recoup amount advanced to Hon. J. W. Trutch, to meet necessary expenses incident to the charge and maintenance of the work, to be expended in 1883-84, \$7,000; Amount required to complete, \$475,827.12, for the

year ending 30th June, 1885.

5. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and fifty thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to pay amount required for construction of Port Arthur Harbour (revote) \$50,000, and Kaministiquia River, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

6. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One hundred and fifty thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray expenses in connection with Cape Tormentine

Harbour, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

7. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Fourteen thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with Halifax Dominion Buildings—Improvements and repairs, \$9,000; Sydney (South) Post Office and Custom House, &c., \$5,000, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

8. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Thirty thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray expenses connected with New Dominion Building, Charlottetown,

Prince Edward Island, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

9. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Three thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray expenses connected with Post Office, Custom House, &c., Moncton, New Brunswick, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.
