and if not employed in the Fishery before that Day, not larger than for 300 Tons.

the same so, the Space of Kive Pears, and no longer, from the said Twenty-sisth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-sir, in case such Ship or Aestel hall not be worn out, or have ceased before that Time to carry on the said Kilbery; and that no Ship or Aestel which shall not, before the Twenty-sisth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-sir, have been employed in the said Kilbery, although such. Ship or Aestel shall be above the Burthen of Three hundred Tons, shall be entitled to a larger Bounty than a Ship or Aestel of Three hundred Tons would be entitled to.

Ships of more than 400 Tons, or 300 Tons, need not be fitted out but as of those Burthens, to entitle them to the Bounty.

IX. Provided also, That nothing in this present At contained thall extend, or be construed to extend, to oblige the Owner or Owners of any Ship or Uestel above the Burthen of Four hundred Tons, or Three hundred Tons respectively before mentioned, to sit out, equip, and man any such Ship, otherwise than as a Ship or Uestel of the Burthen of Four hundred Tons, or Three hundred Tons respectively, according to the Directions of this Ad, in order to entitle him or them to the Bounty herein-before granted.
