

such District, or any one of the said Justices, and they and each of them are hereby required to sit and hold such Terms or Sessions of the said District Court, and continue so to do until a Successor shall have been appointed to such deceased Judge, or that the District Judge so disabled from sitting by reason of sickness shall have therefrom recovered, and the said Justices of the said Court of King's Bench, and each of them, shall then and there in such Terms or Session of the said District Court, have hold and exercise the same powers and authorities as are by this Act given to and vested in the said District Judges, or either of them, and no more, any thing in this Act contained to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding.

Justices of the District Courts may be called to assist in the Divisions of the Court of King's Bench in certain cases &c.

XLIX. And be it further enacted, that whenever any one or more of the Justices of the said Court of King's Bench herein-before constituted, shall be disqualified from or rendered incapable of sitting, either by interest, consanguinity, recusation, sickness, absence, or other cause, and that from all or any of the said causes no two Justices of the said Court of King's Bench can be then and there had to constitute a division of such Court, or that the Justices present in any Division shall be equally divided in opinion upon any Judgment to be therein rendered, it shall and may be lawful for the Justice on such Division who may not be so disqualified or incapable of sitting, or the Justices who may be so equally divided in opinion, to call to his or their assistance the Judge or Judges of the District Court herein-before established in such Division, and such District Judge or Judges so called to assist shall have the same power and authority to hear, try and determine all or any of the causes pending in such Division, as the said Justices of the said Court of King's Bench so disqualified, incapable, or absent, would otherwise have had, or as either of the said Justices so equally divided in opinion may by Law have, and no more: Provided always that the power and authority so given to such District Judge or Judges be by them held and exercised only during the period the Court in such Division may be and remain competent from any of the causes aforesaid; and provided also that the said District Judge or Judges shall not be called upon or considered to be authorised to sit, hear, try and determine any case in which the Court of such Division may be competent to proceed and may not be equally divided as aforesaid.
