### DESMOND PACEY LECTURE

World renowned classicist to deliver Pacey Lecture: Alexander McKay, professor emeritus of classics and art history at McMaster University, will deliver the 1997 W.C. Desmond Pacey Memorial Lecture on both the Fredericton and Saint John campuses of the University of New Brunswick. Titled *Catastrophe Survived: The Alcestis Plays of Euripides*, T.S. Eliot and Thornton Wilder. Dr. McKay's talk will focus on the impact of the Euripidean original on Eliot's *The Cocktail Party* and Wilder's *The Alcestiad* or *A Life in the Sun*. It will take place in Fredericton on Wednesday, Feb. 12 at 8pm in the Wu Conference Centre's J. Harper Kent Auditorium. Dr. McKay's academic contributions took the study to Roman literature, art and architecture are internationally recognized. In particular, Dr. McKay has pursued an interest in the place of poetry in the cultural landscape of ancient Rome and the influences that Roman writers had upon each other's work. During his prolific career, Dr. McKay had held faculty positions at many prestigious universities. His extensive involvement with professional associations includes terms as president of the Royal Society of Canada, the Classical Association of Canada and the Vergilian Society of America. He is the recipient of numerous honorary degrees, an Officer of the Order of Canada, a Knight Commander of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem and a recipient of the Silver Jubilee Medal.
