Thanks very much for your letter of 24th. The less I allow my mind to reflect on the conduct of this man Hepburn, the more I am able to do my work. I certainly could not find language to describe the utter wretchedness of his calumnies, evolved out of his raw and coarse prejudices without the slightest information whatever as to the facts.

As you know, I have already been tried twice without the faintest success on the part of the Hepburn outfit, and in the one case with the accompaniment of a severe castigation against them from the Court. I have to stand another and will do so. I fancy his intention is to have it under one of his own officials so that the official will feel that his job is at stake. He won't risk Judges again.
