Dear Mr. Meighen:

I have just received your kind letter of yesterday's date, regarding Mr. John Dodemiede, and I am immediately taking the matter up with Mr. Heintzleman, the American Consul General in Winnipeg. Under our laws it is the Consular Officers, not the Diplomatic Officers, who are charged with the responsibility of handling all such cases. However, I have been only too happy to bring this particular case, which seems such a sad one, to Mr. Heintzleman's attention for his personal consideration.

You do not say whether Miss Lottie Dodemiede has become an American citizen. If so, there would seem to be no difficulty in arrangements being made for her father's entry into the United States as a non-quota immigrant. But if she maintains her Canadian citizenship,
