Ottawa, 7th April, 1892.

Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 31st ultimo and the letter enclosed therein from Lewis Cloud an Indian of the Stony Point Reserve, County of Lambton, enquiring how much of the funds of the Sarnia, Kettle Point and Stony Point Indians in the hands of the Government belongs to the last two mentioned Bands.

In reply I beg to inform you that the account referred to is a joint one, the capital standing at the credit of the three Bands being \$211,600. This Department has no means of ascertaining what proportion of this amount would be properly claimable by the Kettle Point and Stony Point Indians respectively. I presume however, that it would be the proportion which the population of each of the three Bands would bear to the gross amount that the amount which could with any accuracy be stated to be the share of each of those Bands could be ascertained.
