labors of love are not to be forgotten. It seems as yesterday when Dr. McLeod was traversing the country on evangelistic tours, proclaiming the Gospel as with a tongue of fire; when Mr. Wilson, all meekness and gentleness, was known as the "Apostle John" of Cape Breton; when young Farquharson well proved himself heir of his father for zeal, self-sacrifice and love to God and men. We are sure that, not only in Cape Breton, but in Pictou Presbytery and P. E. Island, this memorial will be welcomed."
