this no one tried to found a colony in Canada, but the fishermen still sailed regularly to Newfoundland.

Fir Humphrey Gilbert. In the year 1583 Sir Humphrey Gilbert. Gilbert set up the royal banner of England on a hill overlooking St. John's harbour, Newfoundland, and took possession of the island in the name of his queen, Elizabeth. But on his return voyage he was lost in a storm, and for forty years no settlement was made.

The Exiles of Sable Island.

By this time people had discovered that they could make much money by trad-

ing in the furs of the beavers and other AGENTLEMAN OF Wild animals which were then so plentiful ELIZABETH'S REIGN in Canada. In 1508 the Marquis de la Roche, a French
