Czarina and Dowager Czarina in the corridor, and among those present were all the Grand Dukes and Grand Duchesses and the Diplomatic Corps, including the United States Ambassador, Mr. Charlemagns Tower, who was accompanied by Mrs. Tower. The Czar wore the insignia of the Order of the Garter. Services were held in the British-American Dissident Church in the afternoon.

Barlin.—Memorial services were held in many towns of the Empire. Among those who attended the services in this city wers United States Ambassador White and Mrs. White. The services at Homburg was attended by the Empress of Garmany, the Hereditary Princess of Saxe-Meiningen, the Crown Princess of Greecs and Princess Frederick of Hesso. At Munich the Prince Regent of Bavaria and other Princes and Princesses attended a service, and at Keil eightyone guns wers fired by the war ships.

At the services in the English Church in Berlin, the Princes August Wilhelm and Oscar, Princess Henry of Prussia, Princes and Princess Frederick Leopold and their sons, and Princes Albrecht, all Hohenzollerns, were present.

Hong Kong.—Services were held in the Cathedral, the Governor and Council, Government officials and British and foreign naval and military officers attending. The Governor of Macao, a seaport town of the Portuguese in China, on a peninsula of the Island of Macao, came here specially to attend the service. A special Chinese service was beld in the afternoon. The Queen's status was decorated with wreaths from all the representative bodies of the community.

Lisbon.—Portugal observed the day as one of national mourning. Everywhere flags were draped. The forts and naval vessels fired guns every quarter of an hour. The theatres were closed,

Copenhagen.—King Christian IX., with all the other members of the royal family, the members of the Cabinst and diplomatists, attended the services in memory of Queen Victoria.

Rome.—At the services in the English Church of All Saints the Marquis Visconti-Venosta, the Minister of Forsign Affairs, represented the King and Ministry. A delegation from the Senate and Chamber of Deputies and the Diplomatic Corps were present, with the English colony.

The Hagus.—Representatives of the Queen and Queen Mother, the Diplomatic Corps and the members of the British colony attended a service of the English Church.
