Coburn, chief of the Live Stock Department of the St. Louis Exposition, has asked for an allot-ment of over thirty acres for the live stock exhibits. On this site will be erected forty-seven buildings, thirty-nine of which will be stock barns with 2,400 open stalls 5 x 10 feet and 400 box stalls 10x10 feet. Four octa-gonal dairy barns will provide 140 open stalls and 28 box stalls. The dates to be fixed for the live stock displays will probably extend from
