Captain Donald A. White of Ottawa whose distinguished services have been officially recognized by General French, is a graduate of the Royal Military College and a son of Colonel Frederick White, C.M.G.

Former Premier Watson of Australia who is now touring Canada began his business life as a printer's devil. He was a journeyman printer for some years, then became president of the Sydney Trades and Labour Council, entered Parliament and finally became Premier of the Australian Commonwealth.

MR. R. H. COATS who has been appointed head of the Dominion Census Department in succession to the late Archibald Blue, has been for some time associate editor to the Labour Gazette.

EARL KITCHENER OF KHARTUM was born in Ireland sixty-five years ago to-day. He is a son of Lieutenant-Colonel H. H. Kitchener of Leicestershire, England who was stationed in Ireland at that time.

SHIPPING BRASS TO GERMANY.
Huntington, W. Va., June 24.—It was stated here by a reliable authority that the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad has just shipped 300,000 pounds of brass to eastern dealers for shipment to the German Government.

PIRATES SUNK 7 FISHING BOATS.
London, June 24.—A German submarine, operating off the Coast of Scotland, has sunk seven British fishing boats in the last forty-eight hours. The crews were saved by other boats.

GERMAN SPY SHOT.
