On Motion, the Bill to prevent the destruction of Sheep by Dogs, received the second reading.

On Motion, the Bill to amend an Act intituled "an Act for preventing Trespasses by unruly horses, cattle, and sheep, and for preventing the running of hogs at large through the Town of Charlotte-Town, by the appointment of Hog Reeves," received the second reading.

Mr. Cambridge one of the Committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieut. Governor with the Address of this House relative to the appointment of Chief Justice Archibald, reported that they had waited on his Excellency with the same, and that his Excellency was pleased to make the following answer, viz.

"Gentlemen.

"I am not aware that it was communicated to me officially; but on Mr.

Archibald's appointment to the Chief Justiceship, I was informed that it was with the understanding that he should have permission to reside in Nova-Scotia.

"J. READY, Lt. Governor.

"February 11th, 1825."

Mr. Cambridge one of the Committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieut. Governor with the Resolutions relative to the Cranberry Island Light House reported, That they had waited on his Excellency, and that his Excellency was pleased to say that he would take great pleasure in forwarding the views of the House on that subject.
