RETAIL MERCHANTS' ASSOCIATION

The local Branch of the above Association, which was organized some time ago by Mr. J. MacDonald, general organizer for the Province of New Brunswick, held a meeting on Tuesday evening, April 13, in the Town Hall.

One of the subjects discussed at the meeting was the need of a wharf on the north side of Deer Island, which would be a very great convenience for the people of the Island, and would enable them to make a quicker trip to St. Andrew and St. Stephen than the present long and tiresome one via Eastport.

The subject of holding a Dollar Day in St. Andrew was also discussed at the meeting, and it was decided to hold one, at a date to be named later, on lines similar to that of the one being held in St. Stephen to-day.

This movement among retail merchants is spreading rapidly, and now covers nearly the whole of Canada. The organization of New Brunswick is about completed, and when this is accomplished every province in Canada, except Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, which are expected soon to come into line, will be included.

Not all the merchants in St. Andrew have joined, but it is hoped and expected that those who have not done so will soon participate in the movement, which is calculated to be of so much benefit to the community, and which is one of the most practical and sensible forms of co-operation that can be devised.

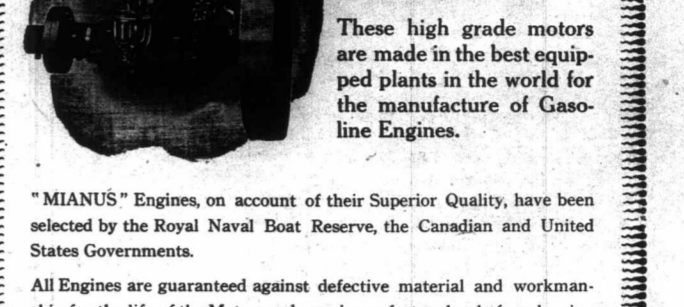
