As these words are being written, the last moments of the year 1919 are dying, and with their death is born a new cycle of twelve months which we are wont to term the New Year.

One may be pardoned for feeling a certain amount of admiration for the old time courtiers at a King's Court, who, whatever had been their love for, or to put it on baser grounds, their material ties of self-interest to an aspiring monarch, were still ready to acclaim his successor in terms of fealty, almost before the breath had left the body of his predecessor, not in the majority of instances because they had any prospective benefits to come, but merely because the inheritor of the Throne was their new King, and as such was entitled to all the veneration they could accord him.

Whether one likes it or not, whether the Old Year has been kind or the reverse, there are but few of us, we fancy, who are not glad that his successor has arrived on the scene. The year just past was the first since the cessation of actual warfare in Europe, and we must confess that we had high hopes at this time last year, that ere the dawn of 1920, world conditions would have been far more satisfactory than they actually are. In the first place PEACE, actual living PEACE, should have been an accomplished fact before today, and we firmly believe that it would have been so, had it not been for the vacillating attitude prompted entirely by party politics which the United States has taken up. In the second place we are fain to confess to a very great degree of disappointment at the fact that the peoples of the world, speaking generally, have been so prone to allow themselves to be carried to the extreme in the other direction that they have utterly failed to realize that while decorum and the strictest economy were absolutely necessary while the war was actually waging, the

effects of the war are still very much apparent and this being the case there is even more need if such were possible, for the exercise of the same qualities.

However, we are not setting out to moralize, nor to cavil at what has happened during the past year. Rather do we wish to point the way to a better understanding, to a better feeling as between man and man, in the year that is now dawning. That this is necessary throughout the world today, cannot be doubted, and if it so elsewhere then it is equally so in Nanaimo. This City is commencing 1920 with a better prospect than was the case twelve months ago. If every citizen of Nanaimo will put his or her shoulder to the wheel during 1920, there can be no reason at all why Nanaimo should not only get out of the rut in which she has been travelling for many years past, but in addition take pride of place with any of the large cities of the West. That she may do so is our earnest wish, and to this end we are willing to ledge our most earnest endeavours.

May 1920 bring to each and every one of our citizens, a greater measure of health, wealth and real prosperity than they have ever known before.

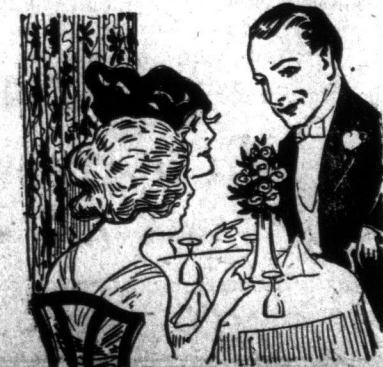
