LONDON, May 7.—The annual meeting of the Iron and Steel Institute today was largely attended. After being formally installed in the chair, the new President, Andrew Carnegie, who maintained that he was the first President of the Institute who was not a British subject, presented Sir James Kitchen, a former President of the Institute, with the Bessemer gold medal. Mr. Carnegie next delivered his inaugural address, which was listened to with much interest.

N. B. AGRICULTURE.

Compilation of Useful and Instructive Information for Farmers.

During the past year a number of the leading skilled stockmen, farmers and fruit growers of Canada have visited the province and from each of them as well as from some of our own farmers Mr. Peters has secured expert testimony. These articles with the report of the Maritime Winter Fair, the Farmers' and Dairywomen's Association and from the Dairy superintendents make a summing up of up to date agricultural knowledge which should not be overlooked by anyone who is farming in New Brunswick.

The discussion on soils and cultivation by such authorities as Mr. C. A. Zavitz of Guelph, Ont., probably the most experienced agricultural experimentalist in America, Mr. J. H. Grisdale, of the Dominion Experimental Farms, and others, contain information of the most vital importance.

Live stock husbandry, seed selection, dairying and fruit growing are all fully treated and deserve close attention. To particularize or quote would require too much space. CLOTHES WASHED.

An Expedient Resorted to by Chicago Hotel to Overcome Strike Effect.

CHICAGO, Ills., May 7.—There is one hotel in Chicago today which has clean linen. The manager of a hotel chartered a tug, loaded it down with a week's wash and started it northward, with instructions to bring the linen back cleansed and ironed, even if it were necessary to go to Canada. The tug Captain stopped in Kenosha, Wis., and sent word to a laundry that there was a parcel of soiled clothes which he wished done in a hurry. The proprietor of the laundry was dumbfounded when his driver brought back several wagon loads of clothes, but the work was done quickly. When it was delivered notification was made that no more work would be accepted from Chicago.

BISHOP OF BUFFALO.

ROME, May 7.—Monsignor Vaccia, Secretary of Propaganda, was received by the Pope today and submitted the report of the congregation of the propaganda on the vacancy in the Bishopric of Buffalo. The Pontiff decided on the appointment of the Rev. Charles H. Colten, rector of St. Stephen's church, New York.

MILLIONAIRE DEAD.

ELORO, Mex., May 7.—August Sahlborg, a multi-millionaire mining man, is dead. He came to Elore ten years ago from Montana. He was without money friends, and after many months of hard labor, struck the vein of what is now the famous Esperanza mine, which in a few years yielded him a fortune of more than \$15,000,000.

WORK OF ITALIAN.

Kills a Fellow Countryman Through Jealousy.

PITTSBURG, May 7.—Tony Greg, an Italian, shot and killed an unknown Italian at Townsend's Lake last night, and in trying to escape he endeavored to shoot Policeman Andrew Terry, who arrested him. It was two hours before the victim's body was removed from the room. Nearly 500 persons gathered about the corpse and when the police tried to disperse them a small riot resulted. The body of the murdered man was trampled upon by hundreds. Additional police arrived and the crowd finally was dispersed. Greg says the trouble resulted over a woman, whose affection both men claimed. He refused to give the dead man's name or tell anything about him.

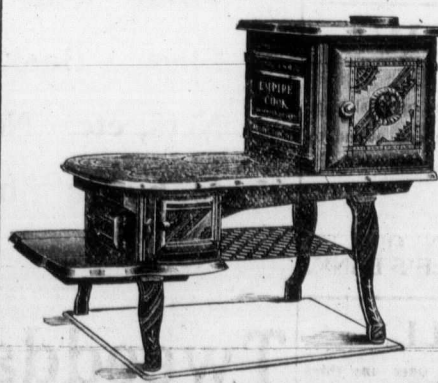
