THE VALUE OF A REPUTATION.

As an ordinary instance of the value of a reputation in the production of food products, the way the price of Danish butter is regulated in England may be cited. The English people are the largest buyers of imported food products in the world. As a rule the price paid to the foreign producer of these products is determined by the ordinary conditions of supply and demand, the price being fixed by what the big importing houses think they can afford to pay, having regard to the chances of sale at the time. But in the case of Danish butter the rule is different. The English importing houses have nothing to do with fixing the price. The price is regulated weekly by a committee representing the Danish producers. The reason of this is, that the Danish butter has established so good a reputation for itself with English consumers that they will purchase it no matter what the price is. Just now Danish butter brings in the English market 14 shillings a hundredweight more than the corresponding grades of American butter, that is, three cents a pound more. This is a very good bonus for a reputation to secure. Of course the Englishman buy where he can buy cheapest, and one
