But in the case of Danish butter the rule is different. The English importing houses have nothing to do with fixing the price. The price is regulated weekly by a

committee representing the Danish producers. The reason of this is, that the Danish tutter has established so good a reputation for itself with English consumers that they will purchase it no matter what the price is. Just now Danish butter brings in the English market 14 shillings a hundredweight more than the corresponding grades of Ameripound more. This is a very good bonus for a reputation to secure.


