FRUIT MEN OFF STREETS.

Retail Grocers Ask City Council to Pass a By-law.

A largely signed petition, bearing the signatures of nearly all the retail grocers in Hamilton, asking that a by-law be passed keeping fruit peddlers off the streets of the city, was presented to the Markets Committee yesterday afternoon.

The aldermen decided to make an investigation before taking any action, and a sub-committee was appointed for that purpose.

Mrs. Williams, of Tapscott, wrote making a claim for injuries received in the butter market on Feb. 14. A butter table fall on her. The communication was referred to the Claims Committee.

The committee had thought of disposing of the old No. 4 police station, on Napier street, but Chief Smith said he did not want the property sold, and the negotiations which were on for that purpose will be dropped.

J. W. RONALD.

One of Notable Group of Old G. W. R. Men.

By the death of Mr. John Ronald, of which notice has already been given, Hamilton loses an old and respected citizen, and one more is taken away from the little remnant of skilled workmen whose names half a century ago were well known in the Hamilton work shops of the old Great Western Railway.

For well nigh twenty years Mr. Ronald was chief foreman of the car department of the Great Western. His period of service with that company covered the days when C. J. Brydges was general manager and Yates, Brad, Richard Eaton and Samuel Sharp were in succession superintendents of the company's work shops.

Mr. Ronald and his fellow foremen of that day were some of the notable group of men. Some of the little band, like the late Jabez Farmer, Mayor of Sacramento, turned their steps to far off fields of labor. Others among them, like D. McCulloch, afterwards editor of the Spectator, and Jas. Stephenson, chairman of the city water works committee for years, gave up railway employment for wider and more congenial spheres of labor.

While others again, like Mr. Ronald, toiled on at the evening of life, content to watch the stir of the great wheel and not feel the crowd. H. R. Whitton, son, and John Hah were among his confidants.

But nearly all of the group have passed to their rest. Blessed with a strong, sturdy physique, Mr. Ronald attained to the age of ninety-five years. If not the last of his fellow foremen to go, no more than two are left in the city to follow him to the grave. May he rest in peace.
