Supreme Council Decides That Huns Must Not Build any Tanks or Manufacture Poison Gas.

London, March 12. The personne of the German fleet is to be restricted to 15,000, the Supreme Council has decided, according to press dispatches from Paris. The military conditions to be imposed on Germany include guarantees that no tanks will be built and no more poison gas manufactured, and that all German war material must be htndtd over and destroyed. It is added that Allied Commissions will supervise the carrying out of these conditions.
