Local Superintendents. To the Editor of the HURON SIGNAL: Permit me through the columns of your valuable paper to give publicity to a few thoughts which have occurred to me. Having been a resident of these countres for the last seven years, I have not been an inattentive spectator to the progress of education, the manner in which it is conducted at the admitted that there are unquestionably some excellent teachers in this county and there are also as inefficient ones, but it is not my province to eulogise on those who merit praise, neither is it my intention to speak praise, neither is it my intention to speak disparagingly of those who are not as accomplished as they might be, yet it is a fact patent to every mind that there is a great disparity in the qualifications of the teachers, and yet they hold the same grade of certificate and, indeed, in many instances the interior teacher has the higher grade. What does this go to praye? evidently that the Board is neglecting to attend strictly to their duty.

It is obvious that the difficulty rests with the members of the Beard and there are several reasons which would naturally lead to this conclusion. As the Educational Board is in a great measure composed of a certain class of cleraymen—of which the public are fully acquainted without further delineation—might they not have a predilection for favoring the teachers embracing the doctrines of their own church in contra distinction to those professing a different faith, or, perhaps, a feeling of nationality might lead to a similar result; this may be considered a narrow wiew of the case, but I think the experience of a number of the teachers throughout the ecunty will endorse this statement and this teachers who are most successful at the Board (not in the school room) are invariably devotees to this faith. Now, Mr. Editor, I do not wish you to consider me an enemy to this or any other class of ministers, far from it, yet I must say with with all seri ousness they are out of their element, they are bartering their high ecclesiastical profession for a few paltry dollars. I do not wish to prohibit them, nor could I if I did, on the contrary I am anxious to have them visit the schools and to have them visit more frequently than they possibly could officially, and give such instruction to the children as local superintendents. Indeed, I think it would not require much logic to prove from the Consolidated Common' School Act that Gave to the Moorish hand
