### Army Praised by Servia's Prince.

dexander Says Austrians Have Been Driven Out-War Booty Large. Paris, Jan. 2.-An address delivervia, commander-in-chief of the Ser-

enemy attacked our beloved country," said the Crown Prince. "Although we had been tried by two glorious and difficult wars, we awaited the attack manfully and heroically. After having defeated the enemy once at Tser and Jadar, we have by bloody and glorious combats delivered a blow harder than any they have inflicted on us up to the present. Thousands of prisoners, hundreds of cannon and immense amounts of booty which we have cantured bear witness to the enemy's defeat and our glory.

"Soldiers, I am proud to announc that not one of the enemy is now on Servian territory. We have expelled him and put him to flight. In this solemn moment, when upon our proud solemn moment, when upon our proud Belgrade the flag of victorious Servia Volunteers from flies, I desire before all to give recognition to your valor."

The prince then eulogized his men comparing them with the ancient heroes who brought glory to Servian

"The end of this gigantic combat now is in sight, although not yet achieved," he continued. "Then will come a peace worthily crowned with victories for our grand Servia. Our ountry will be greater, more powerful and happier than ever. For that, my heroes, Servia will be grateful to

"The Servians will not march on Sarajevo," said Dr. M. R. Vesnitch, the Servian Minister to France, according to a statement by him published here. "They will penetrate either to Syrmia, the eastermost county of Slavonia, Hungary, by way of Semlin or Banat, a region of Southern Hungary, by way of Pancsova.

"The invasion of Bosnia and Herzegovina, populated by Slavs and which are destined to become Servian, would leave the Hungarians indifferent. An invasion of Hungary, however, especially if made by way of the region north of the Danube, would greatly increase the apprehension now reigning in that country.

"The Servian troops are now amply provided with ammunition and sup-
