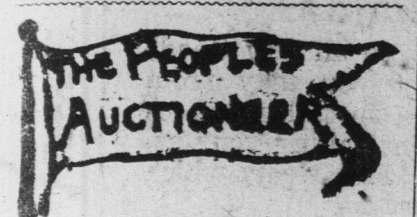

USE STANDARD UNIVERSAL DISINFECTANT FLUID For Drains, Closets, Sinks, Lavatories, Tender Feet, Washing Dogs, Washing Paint, etc.

DIRECTIONS.—Distribute by means of a spray freely over the sick room a weak solution (about 1 oz. fluid to 5 pints water). Bed vessels and other utensils should be thoroughly cleansed with a solution of about 1 part to 10. All Infected Linen and Clothing should be washed in a solution (1 part in 100), and this can be done without fear of injury to the most delicate fabrics, and with the confident expectation of rendering them thoroughly aseptic. A Wise Precaution in case of infectious disease is to shut off the sick room by means of a sheet saturated with a solution of about 1 part in 80. For the Bath—If sufficient fluid to cloud the water be added the effect on the body will be found most exhilarating and refreshing. For the Foot Bath—A teaspoonful of fluid added to the water will be found most beneficial to those troubled with tender feet. Laundrymen and Others will find that for foul and dirty linen an admixture of fluid sufficient to make the water milky will prevent any noxious vapour arising therefrom.
