Armenians!

frequently in recent years, and has often received a very uncertain and somewhat evasive answer. The general impression is that they are a people living, for the most part, somewhere in the Near East, who have become known only because they are the hapless victims of constant persecution and frequent massacre at the hands of their Turkish over-

The Armenians are a race of Indo European stock, related in blood, language and religion to ourselves. While there is a difference of opinion as to their original home, they are found as early as the eight cen tury B.C. in the region west of the Caspian, about the base of Mount Ararat. Here, after many vicissitudes, they finally established an independent state.

This state reached its golden age in the first century B.C. when, under Tigranes the Great, it extended from the Caspian to the Black Sea and from the Caucasus Mountains to Mesopotamia, with a mixed population of twenty-five millions.

In the fourth century of our era, the Armenians, as a nation, accepted Christianity, following the preaching of St. Gregory the Illuminator, and immediately entered upon a struggle with Zoroastrian Persia. This lasted for many years, resulting finally in their subjection to Persia for two centuries.

In the centuries which followed, Armenia was conquered and reconquered. War was almost continual. Greek, Arab. Seijuk and Turk invaders followed each other, and the land was rent and ravaged, Finally, in the eleventh century, the last vostige of an independent Armenian state vanished with the capture of Ant by Alp Arsian.

Crushed and disheartened, many of the Armenians left their native land forever, finding homes in far-distant countries. One group made its way to Lembers, where its descendants have maintained themselves until the present day. It is an interesting fact that old Armenian jurisprudence is still found in the civil code of Lem-

The most adventurous body, including in their number, a descendant of the last king of old Armenia, went south-west into the rocky fastnesses of the Tauras mountains in Cflicia, and there founded the kingdom of Lesser Armenia, which had a stormy existence until the close of the fourteenth century. This kingdom rendered no little service to the Crusaders as they passed through its and with a love of liberty which cen-

But the people of Zeitun lived up to their tradition until the Turks threatened to kill all Armenians in Cilicia, men, women and children, unless they surrendered. On this threat they vielded, and most of them were driven to exile and death. A few, however, took to the mountains, and since the Armistice have returned, and an attempt has been made to rebuild this old Armenian stronghold once more.
