Mr. Thompson, who has been stay ing at the Royal Alexandra hotel while engaged in professional affairs in the city, states that Newfoundland has never been given any rights o ownership to any part of Labrador but was, simply as a matter of admin istrative expediency, given "adminis trative control" of the country. In fact, he goes the length of contending that the whole of Labrador rightly be-

ongs to the province of Quebec. Mr. Thompson's contention is based upon certain statutes to which he alluded. 
