PHILAN'S BILLIARD FACTORY BURNED.—A fire broke out in an immense five story billiard establishment of Philan & Callender, New York, on Saturday morning. The total loss is \$220,000. The amount of insurance is unknown and is believed to be mostly in country offices. The tools of the workmen were lost, averaging a loss to each of from \$50 to \$100. Over 300 finished tables, besides 400 in process of construction were burned.
