exhibition of live stock and implements; and the farm produce and ladies' work was exhibited in an adjacent ware-house. The Acton Brass Band played at intervals during the afternoon. From 1,500 to 2,000 people were present, and everything looked pleasant and cheerful under

the influence of a most beautiful fall day. Horses and sheep were the great features of the live stock department. The horses were a splendid show, and ex-cited universal admiration. The judges in this department went on the "slow

handsome floral design, a nice piece of raised wool work, two pretty cushions, and other needle-work. Nine specimens of meritorious crotchet, work were on the wall, five of embroidery, and five gentlemen's shirts of good workmanship workwomanship we mean.
