To Start Where Taft Stopped.

The Bryan plan aims at the same end that the Taft scheme of general arbitration treaties had. In fact, Mr. Wilson's secretary of state seems to be imbued with the desire to pick the Taft movement up where it was wrecked and by avoiding the features to which the senate objected and by adding a few new ones of his own to darry it through to a successful conclusion.

Members of the senate have learned as yet only a general outline of the Bryan plan, but that is sufficient to indicate that Mr. Bryan, like Secretary Knox, of the Taft administration, hopes by promote world peace through setting up international machinery which will open the way for nations to cool off in times when passions are runting high, and will afford an opportunity for a second thought."

In some of its detail the Bryan plan clearly resembles that outlined by Secretary Knox and embodied in the fragmentary remains of the general treaties ratified by the senate.
